Tent City at Prince of Peace

Prince of Peace Lutheran Church will be hosting Tent City 3 this spring. The emergency shelter encampment will move onto church property on March 27, and will stay through June. On March 31, Tent City 3 will celebrate ten years of continuously providing emergency shelter, together with the help of many, many churches and their neighbors.

Many people have asked how they can help Tent City 3. In the first place, it is good to know that Tent City 3 actively helps <u>us</u>. They conduct a 24-hour guard of the church and its parking lots, so that, for three months at least, break-ins and other anti-social activities should not be a problem for church neighbors! Tent City 3 residents also pick up litter on church grounds and surrounding blocks. Many neighborhoods start to look cleaner and better cared for when Tent City is in residence.

Still, Tent City 3 residents do appreciate the help and support of friends and neighbors. There are some ways you can help.

Shorecrest High School Construction Project

Marcia Harris, Deputy Superintendent of Shoreline Schools, ran a lightly-attended meeting on a beautiful evening, March 24. She presented the current design, which most closely resembles the most radical of the various plans presented at earlier meetings: the only major structure retained from the current school is the theater. The new structures will be LEED certified for environmental impact and follow the Washington Sustainable Schools Protocol. Construction will start in 2011, with occupancy in 2013. There will be up to 18 temporary structures in use during the construction phase.

The new main school building will be taller than the current one at three stories, but much further back from the street. Architects present did not know if there will be any sunlight impact on houses across 25th. Parking and traffic flow on the site will be improved. Designers and school district staff believe that the project as proposed is fully funded. They were receptive to neighbor-generated ideas such as an improved northern entrance to South Woods and using native plants in landscaping. There is still time for your comments and suggestions. White Cards and Neighborhood Sewer Projects in our Neighborhood

"White Cards" show the location of a homeowner's private side sewer. In most cases these maps show location and other information such as depth, clean outs, easements with neighbors, and the connection point to the District's mainlines in the right of way. A "White Card", is available to ratepayers free of charge. (Sample shown below)

Ronald Wastewater is in the process of replacing the sanitary sewer mainlines in the areas listed below. The District will replace private side sewers at no additional cost to a home owner if their private sewer connects to the mainline. The home owner will need only to sign a Right -of-Entry document allowing the District to do the work.


