## **Recology Event**

On Thursday evening, February 6, two representatives from Recology gave us an update on the rules of recycling. There were fifteen people in attendance who kept the presenters engaged with numerous questions about what can be recycled in the **BLUE BIN** and what can be sent to composting in the **GREEN BIN**.

Here are a couple take-aways from the workshop:

- Cedar Grove (GREEN BIN) no longer takes shredded paper because of contamination from shredded credit cards and window envelopes. Place shredded paper in the garbage bin.
  - (**BLUE BIN**) Aerosol food cans, such as PAM or whipped cream, can be recycled with caps removed.
  - **EMPTY, CLEAN, and DRY** are the watch words to remember before placing items in the blue recycle bin to prevent contamination. Empty contents. Rinse bottles or items with water. Then shake the item five times to empty any excess water and place them in the bin.
  - King County no longer accepts plastic bags and wraps in residential curbside recycling bins. Residents are requested to return their clean plastic bags and wraps for recycling to area stores. You may find a nearby store from the website, <a href="https://www.plasticfilmrecycling.org">www.plasticfilmrecycling.org</a>, which lists stores close to you that take plastic film recyclables.
  - Styrofoam can be taken to the Recology Store on Aurora next to the Opus Bank just south of 155th. (No charge for Residents)
  - -Plastic gloves always go in the garbage.
  - -You may call the **Shoreline Recology Store**, <u>205-417-3877</u>, for further questions on what can be recycled.

# Tree Removal and Replacement at Kellogg Middle School

Due to the construction of the new Kellogg Middle School, the flowering plum trees that the Briarcrest Neighborhood Association planted as a volunteer project back in 2002 have been removed from 25th Ave NE between NE 163rd St. and NE 165th St. We are in discussions now with the School District about replacement options.

In addition, we have found out that 30+ trees, most but not all mature, will be removed from NE 165th St between 22nd Ave NE and 25th Ave NE in order to put in a parking lane and sidewalk, required by City Code as frontage improvements. We have requested the City engineers make any changes available to them in order to reduce tree loss. Final design is TBD at this time but will be decided soon.
